



NEW WIC NUTRITION PROVIDER FOR BUCKS COUNTY

MATERNAL AND FAMILY HEALTH SERVICES WILL START DELIVERING THE WIC NUTRITION PROGRAM IN BUCKS COUNTY OCTOBER 1, 2021

Maternal and Family Health Services (MFHS) will be the new provider of the Women, Infants and Children (WIC) Nutrition Program in Bucks County effective October 1, 2021. The current WIC provider, Bucks County Health Department, and MFHS are working together with the Pennsylvania Bureau of WIC to ensure a successful transition with uninterrupted access to WIC services for families in Bucks County.

About Maternal and Family Health Services (MFHS)

MFHS is a nonprofit organization with 47 years of experience in delivering the WIC Nutrition Program. MFHS serves 16 Pennsylvania counties through WIC with dedicated and caring staff delivering nutrition education, providing access to nutritious food through eWIC benefits, offering breastfeeding support, and referrals to health and social services for women, infants, and children. What does this mean for WIC participants?

WIC participants will have uninterrupted access to WIC benefits as MFHS transitions into Bucks County. There will be new WIC Center locations in October, and those details will be provided in advance to participants and partners. MFHS WIC will offer a variety of options for WIC appointments, including phone visits, and convenient locations to load eWIC cards.

What does this mean for health and social service partners in Bucks County?

Collaboration with community partners is essential to connecting with families who could benefit from WIC. MFHS works closely with health and social service providers in southeastern Pennsylvania to refer families to health care and social service programs, and we appreciate the assistance of community partners in referring women, children and families to the WIC Nutrition Program. Our common goal is to connect families to care and services that will promote positive outcomes for children and families in our community.
